National Philanthropy Day 2005 Special Presentation by Naomi Levine: "Maximizing Value to Donors"



You won't want to miss this year's Association of Fundraising Professionals National Philanthropy Day 2005 community celebration! This year's event will be bigger than ever before with the addition of a special morning presentation by Naomi Levine that promises to engage donors, board members, fundraisers, and guests on the topic of "Maximizing Value to

Donors" and the role each of us plays in achieving this.

Mrs. Levine is Special Advisory to the President of New York University, chair and Executive Director of the George H. Heyman, Jr. Center for Philanthropy and Fundraising; and Chair of the Boards of the Edgar M. Bronfman Center for Jewish Student Life and the Taub Center for Israel Studies.

"A fundraiser has a dual obligation," explains Mrs. Levine. "One is to carry out the wishes and plans and programs of the university or organization for whom they work. Two, the donor has faith in me, the fundraiser, so I have an obligation to see that what I promised you and what you want is done. It's a fine line the fundraiser walks. We can't forget, in our zeal to make our goals, the organization's obligation to the donor."

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"There is no Hall of Fame for fundraisers, but if there ever should be, save a wall for Naomi Levine. The legendary architect of New York University's extraordinarily successful fundraising campaigns over the last two decades, she garnered over \$2 billion in donations during her tenure."

A note from our past Chamberlain Scholarship Recipient

As a past recipient our chapter's Chamberlain Scholarship, I want to urge you to not let this opportunity to pass you by. I had been astounded to hear how few applicants there had been so the odds are definitely in your favor!

The Chamberlain Scholarship is a wonderful opportunity for those new to fundraising — or those old pros who've never been to the international conference — to get a substantial portion of their costs covered. The winner receives not only \$500 from AFP International, but the Genesee Valley Chapter chips in another \$500. Last year my out of pocket expenses were only about \$100 even after airfare and hotel (I shared a room.)

So why would anyone want to take the time out of their insane schedules to go to the AFP International Conference on Fundraising?

Well, for starters, it's the largest gathering of fundraisers in the profession. The networking alone is worth it. You can listen to others successes and failures and learn from them. You can brainstorm with your peers. You can even keep your eyes and ears open for new career opportunities if that's what you want to do (but don't say you heard it from me!)

And of course the education sessions are top-notch. There is truly something for everyone — from novice to professional, hospital fundraisers to cultural organizations to educational institutions, and one-person shops to largest of the large development offices.

Another great benefit is the sheer number of vendors available to us in the exhibit hall. Use their wealth of knowledge, get new ideas and shop for whatever it is you need. For me, the timing was perfect last year in that I needed to secure new fundraising software for our office. There had to have been at least 15 or more companies there and I researched them first and met with 6 of them. It was ideal.

But if all that isn't enough, the conference next year is in Atlanta. It won't be on the east coast again until 2010 and Atlanta is a great place to be in April when the weather here in Rochester can be so iffy.

If you drink Pepsi, though, and wouldn't dream of having a Coke, stay home. There'll be nary a Pepsi to be found!

You won't want to miss this opportunity to learn more about assisting the donor who wants to become more engaged with the non-profit, their influence on the organization and nurturing the generations and relationships that lead to future gifts.

Mrs. Levine will also address other topics such as engaging new Philanthropists and creating a fabulous experience for the donor and anecdotes from her 22-year career at New York University.

A graduate of Columbia Law School, Mrs. Levine is expert in constitutional law as it relates to civil rights, civil liberties, churchstate separation, discrimination and the rights of minorities. She was the first woman to serve as Executive Director of the American Jewish Congress; a national organization concerned with the political, social and economic needs of Jews in the United States and the security of people in Israel and Diaspora.

"It's very important to me to see the professionalization of the industry of fundraising," Levine says, and is fond of recounting how her mother advised her not to tell people she was a fundraiser: "People look down on fundraisers." She is quick to give credit to the presidents and board members she has worked with at NYU: "...whatever I was able to achieve in NYU development, I owed a great deal of credit to the volunteers - the board and the president."
